MEN'S LACROSSE



OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK – Roger Williams University junior attacker **Drew Smith** (Blue Point, N.Y.) led the Hawks to a pair of crucial TCCC wins by tallying 16 points (12 goals, four assists) for the week. Smith opened up the week with six goals, two assists, and a pair of ground balls in a 17-11 win over Salve Regina. He followed up with another strong showing, notching six goals and a pair of assists in a 17-4 victory at Wentworth.



DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK – Western New England College sophomore midfielder **Joe Martin** (Springfield, Mass.) played a key role in two conference wins this week for the Golden Bears, winning 77 % of his face-offs and grabbing 15 ground balls. Martin started the week by taking 9-of-14 face-offs and compiling four ground balls in a 15-1 win over Nichols. He then took 18-of-21 face-offs with 11 ground balls in a 12-8 win at the University of New England.



ROOKIE OF THE WEEK – Western New England College freshman midfielder **Zach Robinson** (Middlebury, Vt.) contributed a pair of goals in each of the Golden Bears two contests on the week. Robinson was credited with his first collegiate game-winner in a 15-1 victory over Nichols, also grabbing a ground ball. His two goals against UNE proved to be crucial in a tight 12-8 win on the road.

OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK – Endicott College sophomore midfielder **Morgan DeShaw** (Danville, N.H.) filled up the stat sheet this week, scoring 10 goals and adding six assists totaling a team-high 16 points for the Gulls. She scored a pair of goals in a 18-7 loss to #20 Bates to open up the week. Her best performance came in a crucial conference match-up with UNE, as she scored six goals and tallied three assists in a 18-8 win. DeShaw closed out the week with two goals and three assists in a 21-4 win over Nichols, keeping the Gulls unbeaten at 7-0 in TCCC play. For the week, DeShaw also contributed seven draw controls, six ground balls, and three caused turnovers.



DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK – Roger Williams University senior goalkeeper **Amanda Magee** (Columbus, N.J.) had an impressive week between the posts for the Hawks, recording an astonishing 41 saves with a 82 % save percentage and a stingy 3.61 goals against average. In 43 minutes of action against Rhode Island College, Magee made 14 saves and allowed just three goals in a 16-7 win. She followed up with nine saves and two goals allowed in 46:45 of play against TCCC rival Salve Regina in a 16-4 victory. Magee closed out the week with 18 saves in a 14-4 win over conference foe Colby-Sawyer.



ROOKIE OF THE WEEK – New England College freshman attacker **Katie Palasz** (Granby, Mass.) tallied an impressive 20 points (12 goals, eight assists) in a 3-1 week for the Pilgrims. Palasz scored three goals and an assist in a 14-9 loss to Keene State and three goals and three assists in a 18-8 win over Smith. In conference play, Palasz scored two goals and dished out four assists in a 20-5 win over Anna Maria, then notched four goals in a 21-4 win over Regis. Palasz also recorded 12 draw controls, eight caused turnovers, and eight ground balls on the week.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK – Gordon College senior shortstop/pitcher **Stephen Kefalas** (Wenham, Mass.) batted a strong .545 (13-for-23) with four home runs, two doubles, eight RBI, 10 runs scored and three stolen bases in seven games played. The shortstop/pitcher slammed two home runs in two different Fighting Scot victories over TCCC rival Roger Williams and non-conference foe Lasell. Kefalas, who recorded a 1.174 weekly slugging percentage, hit safely in all seven games and picked up multiple hits in four different games. He was also a force on the mound, tossing 6.1 innings of one-run ball in a hard-fought 1-0 loss to Roger Williams. Kefalas allowed seven hits, one walk and struck out six. His play lifted Gordon to a 4-3 weekly record.



PITCHER OF THE WEEK – Western New England College sophomore **Mike Lawlor** (Windsor, Conn.) was stellar, as he saved all three games in which he appeared, including outings against #11 Eastern Connecticut State and TCCC rival Curry. Against #11 ECSU, Lawlor entered a 9-6 game with two men on base and promptly retired the side. He struck out four batters in 2-1/3 innings of work. Against a Curry team that was batting a league-best .408 and averaging a conference-high 12.9 runs per game in TCCC play, Lawlor earned the save, striking out the only batter he faced in a 3-2 game with a runner in scoring position. He closed out the week with three scoreless innings and five strikeouts against TCCC foe Colby-Sawyer. In 5.2 scoreless innings of work, Lawlor struck out 10 batters.



ROOKIE OF THE WEEK – Roger Williams freshman pitcher **Ben O'Shea** (Reading, Mass) posted a 2-0 record with a 2.08 ERA over the course of two starts against Suffolk and TCCC rival New England College. Against Suffolk, O'Shea scattered six hits and allowed just one earned run in seven innings of work. Against NEC, O'Shea allowed just two earned runs on five hits in six innings. Over 13 innings for the week, O'Shea allowed just three earned runs on 11 hits. He struck out 12 and did not walk a batter.

SOFTBALL



PLAYER OF THE WEEK – Western New England College senior center fielder **Lauren Arsenault** (Fitchburg, Mass.) batted a solid .545 (18-for-33) with four doubles, seven RBI and 11 runs scored and helped the Golden Bears to a 9-1 weekly record, including an 8-0 mark in TCCC play. Arsenault closed out the week with seven consecutive multiple-hit games as WNEC improved to a perfect 12-0 in conference play with doubleheader sweeps of Curry, Eastern Nazarene, Gordon and Wentworth. Over the course of the week, Arsenault hit safely in nine of 10 games played and did not strike out in 33 official at bats. She was also flawless in center field.



PITCHER OF THE WEEK – Endicott College junior **Jenna Bortolotti** (Milton, Mass.) was a winner each time she stepped into the circle, posting a 6-0 weekly record with a miniscule 0.84 ERA over 33.1 innings of work. Over the course of four starts and two relief outings Bortolotti allowed just 16 hits and 17 walks, which striking out 28 in 33-plus frames of work. She compiled four complete games and posted one shutout against TCCC rival Regis. In six games, opposing batters hit just .140 against Bortolotti.



ROOKIE OF THE WEEK – New England College freshman outfielder/pitcher **Gabrielle Timms** (Clark Summit, Pa.) was a force at the plate and in the circle, as she led the Pilgrims to a 5-3 weekly record against TCCC opponents, including back-to-back doubleheader sweeps of Curry and Salve Regina. Offensively, Timms batted .462 with a .654 slugging percentage. She collected 12 hits in 26 at bats, to go with two doubles, one home run and six RBI. She batted safely in seven of eight games played. As a pitcher, Timms posted a 2-2 weekly record with a 2.33 ERA and four complete games. She posted wins over TCCC opponents Curry and Salve Regina, allowing just two earned runs in 14 innings against those opponents.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK – Nichols College freshman **David Drucker** (Bellmore, N.Y.) won all eight of his individual matches, posting a 4-0 mark in straight sets across the top three singles positions and teaming with Eliot Wuhrmann for a 4-0 tally at #2 and #3 doubles.
