## THE COMMONWEALTH COAST CONFERENCE ATHLETES OF THE WEEK

### MEN'S LACROSSE



**OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK** – Endicott College senior midfielder **Brad Lipkvich** (Madison, Conn.) led the Gulls to their best week this season, as they posted wins over Williams (14-9) and conference rival Western New England (9-8). Lipkvich notched three goals and a ground ball in each contest with nine of his 10 shots on the week hitting the cage.



**DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK** – Endicott College junior defender **Andrew Pochebit** (Portland, Maine) tallied seven ground balls and forced six turnovers in a pair of impressive victories for the Gulls. In a 14-9 win over Williams, Pochebit had two ground balls and caused four turnovers. Pochebit then had five ground balls and forced two turnovers in a huge TCCC win over Western New England.



**ROOKIE OF THE WEEK** – Wentworth Institute of Technology freshman attacker **Mark Pappas** (Worcester, Mass.) recorded 10 points in two games for the Leopards on the week. He scored the go-ahead goal with 4:56 left in a 8-7 win over Anna Maria, also adding eight ground balls and an assist in the game. Pappas had his best performance of the week in a 20-12 win over Becker, as he scored five goals, notched three assists, and also scooped up a pair of ground balls.

Pappas did not play in a 13-6 loss to Gordon.

### WOMEN'S LACROSSE



**OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK** – University of New England junior midfielder/attacker **Danielle Cate** (Boscawen, N.H.) scored a school-record nine goals to open up the week with a 22-12 win over Salve Regina, she also recorded three draw controls, two ground balls, and an assist in the contest. Cate followed up with six goals, one ground ball, one draw control, and a caused turnover in a 15-10 win over Southern Maine.
