OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK – Western New England College junior attacker **Joe O'Keefe** (Branford, Conn.) led the Golden Bears with eight points in a 2-0 week in TCCC play as they remained unbeaten thus far in conference action. O'Keefe had two goals and three assists in a 21-10 win over Curry to begin the week, then followed up with a pair of goals and an assist in a 21-4 victory over Wentworth.



DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK – Gordon College junior defender **Stuart Knechtle** (New Canaan, Conn.) and the Fighting Scot defense came-up huge in a 7-5 win over cross-town TCCC rival Endicott, the first win over Endicott since the 2003 season. Knechtle scooped up 12 ground balls in the win. In a 15-8 conference win over Salve Regina, Knechtle grabbed nine ground balls for the Fighting Scots.

At the plate, Scafidi batted .750 (15-for-20) with four doubles, two triples, 16 RBI and eight runs scored. He collected multiple hits and drove in at least one run in each of the AMCATS' six games, including six hits and eight RBI in a doubleheader sweep of Norwich, five hits and two RBI in a TCCC split with Gordon, and four hits and six RBI in a TCCC sweep of Colby-Sawyer. In addition to posting a 1.150 slugging percentage and a .750 on-base percentage, Scafidi also hurled a three-hit shutout in the opening game against Colby-Sawyer. He struck out nine and walked just one in the 13-0 triumph.



PLAYER OF THE WEEK – Curry College senior first baseman **Rick Vail** (Lynnfield, Mass.) batted .750 (8-for-12) with three doubles, eight RBI and 10 runs scored in just three games played, as Curry slugged its way to a perfect 3-0 weekly record and ran its perfect TCCC record to 7-0. Vail opened the week with two hits, a RBI and a runs scored in Curry's 16-15 slugfest win at Eastern Nazarene. He followed with seven hits, seven RBI and nine runs scored in a doubleheader sweep at Salve Regina. Vail, who also drew five walks to bolster his weekly on-base percentage to .778, was a big part of a Colonels' lineup that outscored the opposition 54-19 over the three games played.



PITCHER OF THE WEEK – Nichols College senior **Tim Smith** (Plainfield, Conn.) allowed just one hit in eight scoreless innings of work, picking up a win and a save in the Bison's first doubleheader sweep of Roger Williams since 2005. In the opening game, Smith tossed a one-hit shutout in which he faced the minimum 21 batters. He walked one, struck out four, and needed just 70 pitches to go the distance. Smith retired the final 15 batters of the game and did not allow a single runner to reach second base. In the nightcap, Smith retired the side on just seven pitches.
