## THE COMMONWEALTH COAST CONFERENCE ATHLETES OF THE WEEK

### *MEN'S LACROSSE*



**OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK** – Endicott College senior midfielder **Brad Lipkovich** (Madison, Conn.) led the Gulls to their first conference title since 2007 with a seven point week in a pair of playoff games. Lipkovich scored three goals in a 10-6 semifinal win over Roger Williams, and followed up with three goals and an assist in a 11-6 victory over New England College in the championship game.



**DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK** – Endicott senior goalkeeper **Eric Hagarty** (Sudbury, Mass.) helped backstop the Gulls to their sixth TCCC title in program history by posting a 63% save percentage and a 6.00 goals against average in two playoff games last week. Hagarty made 14 saves in the conference championship game to cement an 11-6 victory.



**ROOKIE OF THE WEEK** – Endicott College freshman attacker **Connor McCormack** (Norwalk, Conn.) had three goals in the TCCC Championship game, including the game-winner, to help lift Endicott to its first conference title since 2007 with an 11-6 triumph over NEC. ### Endicott captures 2010 TCCC Men's Lacrosse Championship; 11-6 over New England College

BEVERLY, Mass. – Senior **Brad Lipkvich** (Madison, Conn.) and freshman **Connor McCormack** (Norwalk, Conn.) each tallied three goals apiece while goalkeeper **Eric Hagarty** (Madison, Conn.) made 14 saves as Endicott College defeated New England College, 11-6, to win the 2010 The Commonwealth Coast Conference Championship on a rain-soaked afternoon in Beverly, Mass. The conference title is the program's sixth and its first since 2007. The Gulls now await word from the NCAA Selection Committee as to who their first round opponent will be.

A fast moving first quarter yielded just a single goal, which came off the stick of Connor McCormack 4:11 into the contest. The quick-footed attackman swept from his right to left, freezing New England College goalkeeper **Nick Fischer** (South Burlington, Vt.) with a hard overhand shot to give the Gulls a 1-0 lead.

The Blue and Green exploded for a four goal outpouring in the second quarter, its highest scoring frame on the day. **Jonathan Prentice** (Chelmsford, Mass.) scored on a short-side snipe, followed by a fast break man-up strike from **Brendan McCarthy** (Arlington, Vt.). Lipkvich scored his first of the day with 5:43 remaining before halftime after he gathered his own rebound off the post and shoveled the put-back past an outstretched Fischer to give the hosts a commanding 4-0 lead.

The Pilgrims got on the board 1:24 later when **Matt Vozzolo** (Somers, Conn.) took a feed off goal line extended from **Chris Harris** (Baltimore, Md.) and finally broke through Eric Hagarty with a shot to the low-right corner. The Gulls got the goal back before the intermission, however, when **Colin Prescott** (Norwalk, Conn.) walked out in front and stuck a bid into the upper left corner to give Endicott a 5-1 lead at the intermission.

The two sides traded goals throughout the third quarter, with each team scoring three times apiece in the frame. NEC's **Matt Carey** (Medford, N.Y.) got the scoring started just 29 seconds into the third, only to have Jonathan Prentice fire back just 2:23 later. Vozzolo scored his second of the day, followed by back-to-back tallies from Connor McCormack just 54 seconds apart. **John Gabriel** (West Nyack, N.Y.) kept the visitors within striking distance at 8-4 heading into the fourth after he scored on an overhand shot top-shelf for the final tally of the third.

Endicott grabbed the game for good in the fourth quarter, scoring just 20 seconds into the frame on a crank shot from Lipkvich off a pass from **Jack Curtis** (Chelmsford, Mass.). John Gabriel responded at the 9:51 mark, only to have **Chris Gugino** (West Hartford, Conn.) retaliate a mere 19 seconds later with a goal of his own. Lipkvich scored again, for good measure, before the Pilgrim's **Clint McDonough** (Mountain Lakes, N.J.) completed the scoring for an 11-6 final.

Both goalkeepers were stellar on Saturday, with Hagarty making 14 saves and his counterpart Nick Fischer turning in his second 20-save performance of the postseason. Fischer made 14 saves in the first half, while Hagarty played his best in the second and fourth quarters, making four saves in each frame.

Brad Lipkvich led the way with three goals and one assist, while McCormack had three goals of his own. Jonathan Prentice scored twice and Jack Curtis dished out three helpers. Three other Gulls notched single tallies in the win.

New England College got a pair of goals from both John Gabriel and Matt Vozzolo. Matt Carey had one and one while Chris Harris tallied two assists.

Endicott outshot NEC at a 46-28 clip, including 30-11 in the first half. The Gulls held a 41-32 advantage in groundballs and also won 12 of the game's 19 face-offs.

The Blue and Green return to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2007. The Gulls will learn their first round opponent on Sunday evening, with opening round play beginning the weekend of May 15-16.

### Endicott claims fifth straight TCCC Women's Lacrosse title; 10-4 over Roger Williams

BEVERLY, Mass. – The Endicott College women's lacrosse team defeated Roger Williams University, 10-4, to grab its fifth consecutive The Commonwealth Coast Conference Championship on Saturday afternoon in Beverly, Mass. With the win, the Gulls (16-4) have earned the automatic qualifier into the NCAA Tournament. Roger Williams (14-5) hopes to grab a bid into the upcoming ECAC Tournament.

Roger Williams broke open a scoreless game at the 22:30 mark in the first half when **Kate Malenczak** (Sayville, N.Y.) gave the Hawks a 1-0 lead on a free position shot. Eventually, Endicott's **Kellie Cunningham** (Derry, N.H.) knotted the game at one goal apiece as the junior dodged through the middle and buried a shot in the top right corner.

The Hawks took their second lead of the game as **Claire Halliday** (Trenton, N.J.) scored on a Malenczak feed on the fast break for a 2-1 lead. The Gulls responded a mere :13 seconds later as **Valerie Feldman** (Albany, N.Y.) entered into the scoring column with her free position tally to tie the game at 2-2. Endicott took its first lead of the game when **Kristen Micho** (Syracuse, N.Y.) intercepted a lazy Roger Williams pass and stick-faked the RWU netminder before scoring on the open net.

The back-and-forth first half continued when Malenczak scored her second goal of the game on a pass from **Kasey Beckwith** (Franklin, Conn.) to tie the game at 3-3. **Morgan DeShaw** (Danville, N.H.) gave EC the lead for good with 6:13 remaining in the opening half on a free position goal to put the Gulls on top, 4-3, headed into the break.

Cunningham and Feldman opened the second stanza with back-to-back unassisted scores to push the Endicott lead up to 6-3. Malenczak notched her third goal of the game, on a free position shot, to make it a 6-4 ballgame, but that would be as close as the Hawks would get. Valerie Feldman scored her third goal of the game with 13:49 remaining before senior Kristen Micho scored three-straight goals to end the game and give Endicott a 10-4 win and its fifth-straight TCCC Championship.

Endicott outshot the Hawks at a 26-8 clip while also holding the edge in groundballs (38-28) and draw controls (11-5). The Gulls were also better on clear attempts, 10-of-12 compared to 11-of-24 for RWU, while Roger Williams made more turnovers (19-12) but held the advantage in saves (10-1).

Kristen Micho led all scorers with four goals while causing a pair of turnovers and picking up two groundballs. Valerie Feldman scored three goals and had a team-high four groundballs while Kellie Cunningham also scored a pair of goals. **Kendahl Light** (South Hero, Vt.) led the defense with four caused turnovers while Morgan DeShaw and **Carin Czerniawski** (Monroe, Conn.) each picked up five groundballs apiece. **Leah Neff** (South Berwick, Maine) made one save in picking up the victory.

Roger Williams was led by Kate Malenczak's three goals and one assist while Claire Halliday had the other tally for the Hawks. **Erica Palmer** (Branford, Conn.) scooped up a team-high five groundballs and had four caused turnovers while **Danica Delia** (Norwalk, Conn.) had a pair of draw controls. **Lauren Ferri** (Northport, N.Y.) also added four caused turnovers. **Amanda Magee** (Columbus, N.J.) made 10 saves on 26 shots faced.

Endicott now advances to its fifth-straight NCAA appearance and awaits word on who they will play in the first round later this week. Roger Williams hopes to hear about an ECAC Tournament bid, with action also beginning later this week.
