BASEBALL



PLAYER OF THE WEEK – Wentworth Institute of Technology sophomore outfielder/pitcher **Doug Papuga** (Branford, Conn.) played a key role in helping the Leopards to a 7-1 weekly record during their spring break trip to Florida. Papuga batted .407 (11-for-27) with four doubles, four RBI and seven runs scored, while hitting safely in seven of eight games and turning in three multiple-hit contests.
