BASEBALL



PLAYER OF THE WEEK – Gordon College sophomore catcher/second baseman/pitcher **Stephen Kefalas** (Wenham, Mass.) enjoyed a strong week as the Fighting Scots posted a 4-3 record, including two conference sweeps over Salve Regina and New England College. In six games at the plate, Kefalas batted .474 (9-for-19) with two doubles, a triple, six RBI, five runs scored and three stolen bases. In Gordon's first wins over Salve Regina since 1998, Kefalas delivered a key two-run triple in a 9-8 win in game one, while picking up the win with five strong innings of work in the nightcap. Coupled with six solid innings on the mound, Kefalas' walk-off RBI single in game two clinched a doubleheader sweep over NEC. Kefalas hit safely in all six games in which he batted, including a trio of two-hit performances.



PITCHER OF THE WEEK – Roger Williams University sophomore **Dan Roberge** (Oakdale, Conn.) pitched the first perfect game in Roger Williams history, as he retired all 21 batters he faced in the Hawks' 1-0 win over Wentworth in the first game of Sunday's doubleheader against Wentworth. Roberge struck out three. Nine outs were registered on the ground, while another nine outs were made through the air.



ROOKIE OF THE WEEK – Gordon College freshman shortstop **Stephen Myhren** (Vernon, N.J.) batted .318 (7-for-22) with three RBI and three runs scored in seven games, as the Fighting Scots posted conference sweeps of Salve Regina and New England College. Myhren hit safely in six of seven games last week and collected what proved to be the difference-making RBI in a 9-8 win over Salve last Monday.

She tossed a pair of two-hit, complete-game shutouts and added a pair of five-inning outings in which she surrendered just one hit. Jakiela walked just five batters in four games.



ROOKIE OF THE WEEK – Nichols College freshman outfielder/designated player **Shaleese Young** (Salt Lake City, Utah) continued her strong play, leading the Bison to a 4-0 weekly record.
