MEN'S LACROSSE



OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK – Salve Regina University sophomore attacker **Chris Walker** (Marshfield, Mass.) tallied 11 points (8 goals, 3 assists) in two games for the Seahawks this week. Walker scored five goals, added a pair of assists, and had seven ground balls in a near upset (10-9) of conference rival #17 WNEC. He followed up with three goals, an assist, and five ground balls in a 11-4 win over MIT to close out the week.



DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK – Western New England College junior midfielder **Colin Houlihan** (Yorktown Heights, N.Y.) recorded 14 ground balls and won 19-of-35 faceoffs (54.3%) as the Golden Bears went 2-0 in TCCC play.
